Minutes from last meeting January 14th, 2023

Each July marks an official anniversary for our South Georgia Chapter, which had its beginnings in Hazlehurst, Ga, in July 1993. 30 years together, of births and deaths and countless life events in between, all marked by a mutual love of Studebakers....all makes and models and kinds....as varied as the members themselves.

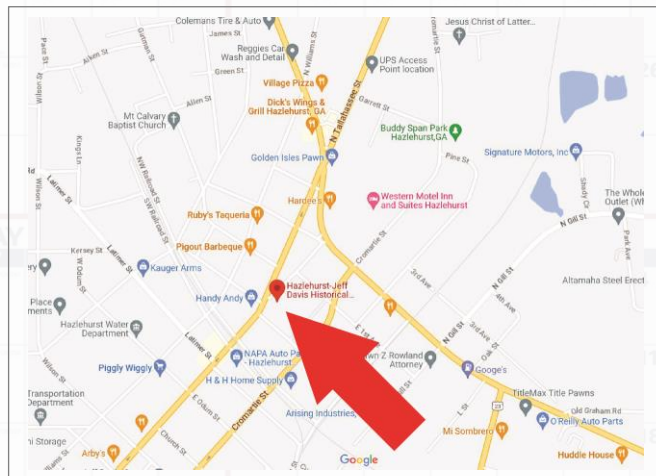
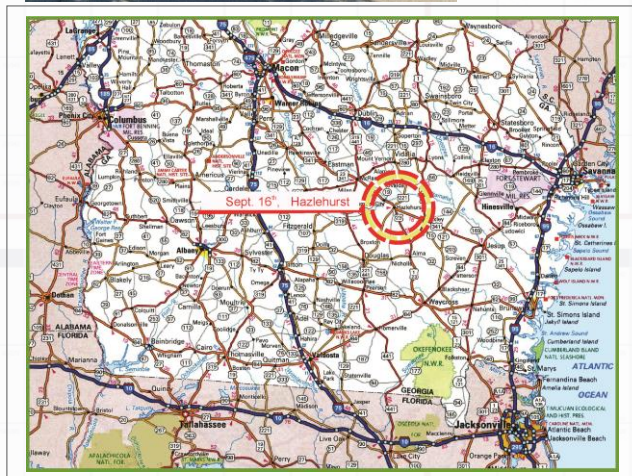

Hi Terry, you asked if I would share details of our efforts to enhance the appearance and performance of the 1963 Studebaker Gran Turismo I purchased in March of this year. I believe we made a few nice improvements. It is important to note that the car had undergone extensive renovations by the previous owner(s). It is most unfortunate that a "box" of documents promised to me at the time of purchase was not provided to me by the seller. This lack of information diminishes not only the value of the car but also the potential enjoyment of seeing just how much effort must have been exerted to upgrade the car to the condition it was in when purchased.

We promptly purchased a shop manual as well as a chassis and parts catalog.

We made a few mechanical interventions including motor mounts and transmission mounts and a minor tune up.

We painted the wheel rims to match the car. We received estimates as high as \$15,000 for a paint job, but we were very satisfied by the "Excellent Driver" paint provided by Maaco for well less than \$3,000.00. (Jason is a real paint veteran who likes to paint old cars). (912) 226-7312. The dash was an old, faded vinyl wood grain. It was replaced by a hammered aluminum pattern Wrap which looks great. Taylor at G-Force films in Savannah (912) 655-2888 did excellent work, in my opinion. We replaced some of the older badging.

We replaced the horn relay, and the 2-tone sound is great. We replaced the wiring and bulb for the fender well set up which lights the



acrylic "wings" on the fenders. We repaired the wiring for the trunk light and hood engine light. We fixed the radio which now plays the AM gospel station in Savannah. We replaced the rear speaker as well as the rear decking and the trunk front wall.

We spent several hours rebuilding the reclining gear for the passenger seat. The seat now reclines safely and sits in the appropriate position.

We purchased new adjustable vents for the air conditioning unit, spiffed up the casing, and added aluminum vinyl to enhance its appearance. The interior required minor cleaning. We removed the leather wrap on the steering wheel, preferring instead the original black beautiful but pitted wheel. (I was unsuccessful in finding a white steering wheel new or used. (I should note that the ladies at Studebaker International were very helpful). The clock works and is keeping the correct time.



Studebaker floor mats were not available, so I purchased nice plain mats then took a picture of the large Studebaker emblem on the trunk of the Studebaker then had it digitized so that it could be used as a pattern for the mats and a smaller version for a patch for my shirt. This worked out very well and was inexpensive. We replaced the old trunk mat with the same factory pattern.



We purchased a hood liner but haven't installed it. The interior hood surface looks good after the paint job. We did clean the engine as well.

The engine did have a stalling problem. This has been eliminated by the use of marine ethanol-free gas and use of octane booster.

The car seems to have been well received at a few shows and generates frequent friendly conversation and comments when on the road. I am enjoying it!

I will gladly give credit for much of this work to my friend, David Capallo. We did this together, but he is "way more talented" than me.

Brake Fluid Testing

Automotive brake fluid does a great job of activating the brake cylinders that, in turn, push the brake shoes against the drum, so we can stop our Studebaker when we need to. However, brake fluid has a downside you need to be aware of, namely; it absorbs moisture from the environment. The technical term for this is Hygroscopic. Hygroscopic is the phenomenon of attracting and holding water molecules via adsorption from the surrounding environment. When this occurs, the moisture content can change the chemistry of the brake fluid, which can **negatively** affect how well your brakes work. Additionally, the extra moisture will cause the metal in your braking system to begin to corrode and rust.

This hit home recently as I've been helping a young fellow resurrect his 1957 Studebaker Transtar pickup. While jockeying the truck around the yard, one of the rear brakes locked up solid. No amount of rocking it with the engine would free it. This could have been disastrous if we'd been out and about town in it.

I found the brake master cylinder was full of brake fluid, but it was a dirty rusty brown color, certainly not what I expected to see. Tearing into the brakes I found the wheel cylinder components were rusty and inhibiting the free movement of the components which is why the wheel had locked-up.

Seeing this I became concerned about the brakes in our other Studes. What I needed was a quick and easy way to check the moisture content of brake fluid. The answer was found in a small device that looks like an ink pen called a **Brake Fluid Tester** available at auto parts stores and online parts outlets as well, often for less than \$20.

Powered by a small battery, the tester has green, yellow, and red LEDs, and two metal contacts at one end. **The operation is simple:** install the battery, turn on the tester, dip the metal contacts into the fluid bowl of your brake master cylinder. The tester measures the moisture content and lights up the appropriate LED. Before testing the Transtar, I tested an old bottle of DOT3 that's been on the shelf for several years. It lit up the yellow LED. I also tested a new bottle of DOT3 and it lit up the green LED. When I tested the Transtar, the tester lit up the red LED indicating too much moisture in the brake fluid – thus confirming why I was seeing the rust in the brake system.

We all spend a lot of time making our Studebakers look good. Why not spend a minute checking your brake fluid to ensure you and your family's safety?!

Which oil should my Studebaker use?

Like some other Studebaker owners, I have been using Castrol Diesel 15W40 oil in my 1947 Studebaker Champion for a few years. This gave the car excellent oil pressure while using much less oil. I was happy.

The long-time experts who wrote the Studebaker Co-operator feature in Turning Wheels, such as Jim Pepper and the late Bob Palma disagree. They very strongly stated that oil intended for Diesel engines should never be used in any engine with flat-tappet camshafts. Their reasons appear in recent issues of Turning Wheels. When people with their expertise speak, I pay attention.

Oil Pressure Hoses

Oil pressure hose, between the Engine to the Gauge!

Perhaps this hose is the original and it had been on the car ever since new, or it could have been replaced one or more times by now. Still, it is a good idea to check it before you take the Studebaker out on the road so that it reduces the probability of having trouble with it while you are driving.

The location of the hose is towards the rear of the engine compartment, next to the firewall.

The lower end of the hose is connected to the engine. The top end of the hose is connected to a solid line that goes through the firewall and attached to the oil pressure gauge.

Through time, the hose will deteriorate. When the engine is operating, this hose is under pressure and heat and needs to be flexible as the engine "rocks" each time there is acceleration or deceleration.

If you find the hose to be hard and inflexible, it is time to change it.

What engines have flat-tappet camshafts? All engines built by Studebaker, and just about any other make that DOES NOT have hydraulic valve lifters.

So, what oil should we use? Bob and Jim recommended Valvoline VR-1 Racing Oil, or any other oil specifically rated for collector-car engines with flat-tappet camshafts. Other good oils are Z-Rod 20W50 Synthetic, Lunati 15W50 Hi-Zinc, Mobil 1 Flat-Tappet 10W40, Brad Penn, Lucas, Amsoil, Royal Purple 20W50, etc. These are compounded with the correct formulas which include ZDDP additive.

CarQuest sells Valvoline VR-1 Racing Oil at a few of its stores, including Moncton and Dieppe.

V8s and the right rear lower corner on six- cylinder engines can become a big problem. These hoses are made of rubber and must carry whatever oil pressure shows on the gauge. On some engines when they are cold it could be as high as 80 pounds.

If your car has an oil light then it doesn't have a hose, so no need to worry about it.

To check this hose, first open the hood and locate the hose. It will be on the passenger side, rear of the engine. It comes up to connect to a copper line covered with rubber that runs along the firewall from left to right. Take hold of the hose and bend it and wiggle it a little. You may be surprised to find it break off in your hand. If it breaks while you are driving, you may end up needing an engine overhaul if you don't catch it in time.

If you are going to replace it, the best way is to cut off the hose just above the brass fitting that screws into the head and use a six- point 7/16 socket on it. If you use an open-end wrench, it may be so tight that the hex will collapse and strip off. Then you have a hell of a time getting it out. The Studebaker number for the V8 hose is #530096. It is suggested that you keep one in the glove box as they are pretty cheap.

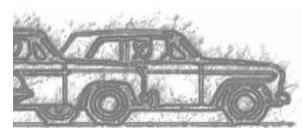

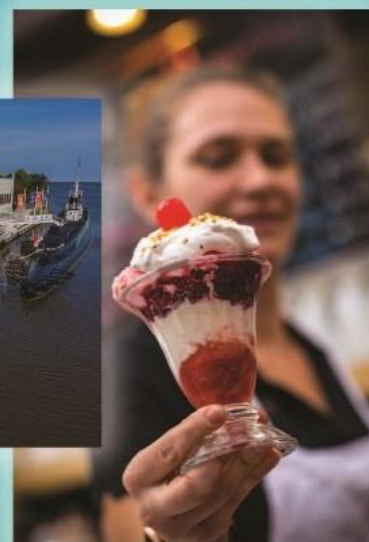
