Yes, when I was 15, in 1964 I was learning to drive my Dad's 1959 Lark Wagon around Jacksonville Beach Florida. The clutch went out in it, probably due to my driving lessons, and I learned how to replace a clutch. Sometimes, If you didn't shift just right, the linkage would hang up between gears. I learned how to fix that.

During that year, Daddy bought a 1948 Champion convertible from a neighbor for the grand sum of \$35.00. I finished my driving lessons in that car. I suppose Daddy didn't want to put his Lark at any more risk.

When I turned 16 in March 1965, I got my driver's license in that '48 Champion. When I finished that school year, we moved back to Southwest Georgia.

At age 16 I drove that 17-year-old Ragtop from Jacksonville Beach to Camilla Georgia. The scariest part of the trip was getting through the big city of Jacksonville. (That's still scary), The second part was I-10 to I-75, north to Valdosta. There we got on back roads through small towns like Quitman, Thomasville, Cairo, Meigs, and Pelham. Quite an adventure for a Teen aged boy who only had a driver's license for two months.

60 years later I still have Studebakers. I have not been without at least one for more than a few months. at a time. I

have another old Ragtop very similar to the one I started out with and who knows, I may drive it to Camilla one of these days.

My entire family has been involved in the Studebaker hobby with me. My Wife and all my children have all driven Studebakers along with most of my Grandchildren. We have had many adventures with these old cars, and they have made our lives very interesting through the years.

I am often approached by strangers who will ask me "Hey, Aren't you the Studebaker man?" I will answer with pride "Yes I am!"

One of the greatest treasures I have gained is the group of friends I have gained through the Studebaker Drivers Club. This became evident Yesterday as I began receiving Happy Birthday wishes from as far away as Washington State and all points in between.

I treasure my friends and fellow Club Members. Hope to see you all in Savannah.

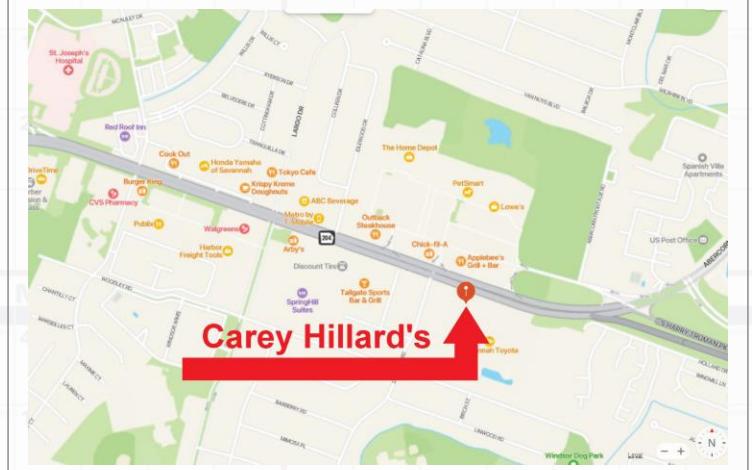

### Recipes

#### Chef Ann Kim's Foolproof Sweet Potato Carrot Cake



*A holiday favorite from the Garden & Gun Club at the Battery Atlanta*

#### PREPARATION

Make the cake: Preheat oven to 350°F. In a medium bowl, mix flour, baking powder, cinnamon, nutmeg, ginger, and salt. In another bowl, mix eggs, brown sugar, oil, buttermilk, sweet potato puree, and vanilla extract. Add dry ingredients to wet ingredients bowl and whisk. Add remaining ingredients, Spray two 9-inch cake rounds with nonstick baking. pray. Divide batter between the two pans. Bake for 15 minutes and rotate. Set timer for an additional 10 to 15 minutes until cake is fully cooked through. Allow cakes to cool in baking pan on cooling rack. Remove cakes after 10 minutes and place back on cooling rack. Allow cakes to cool completely. While cakes are cooling, make frosting. Make the frosting: Using a stand mixer with paddle attachment, add butter and cream cheese. Start on low and gradually increase speed to medium until blended. Use rubber spatula to scrape off the sides. Turn speed off. Add vanilla and powdered sugar. Start at lowest speed to prevent the powdered sugar from getting everywhere. Gradually bring speed up to high. Once again use spatula to scrap off the sides and continue mixing until incorporated. You can make this a two-layer cake or take the two layers and slice them horizontally in half to get four halves. This will create a four-layer cake. Divide frosting in half. Use half of the frosting to spread on all the layers of cake. Use the remaining half to cover the exterior of the cake. Sprinkle pecans on top of frosted cake along edge. Serve.

#### INGREDIENTS (10–12 SERVINGS)

2 tsp. baking powder  
2 cups all-purpose flour  
½ tsp. baking soda  
1 tbsp. cinnamon, ground  
½ tsp. nutmeg, ground  
½ tsp. ginger, ground  
1 tsp. salt  
4 large eggs, room temperature  
1½ cups light brown sugar, packed  
⅔ cup vegetable oil  
⅓ cup buttermilk  
2 tsp. vanilla extract  
1 cup sweet potatoes, roasted and pureed  
1½ cups carrots, grated  
½ cup pecan pieces, toasted  
1 orange, zested  
½ cups toasted pecans, for garnish (optional)  
**FOR THE CREAM CHEESE FROSTING**  
1 lb. cream cheese, softened  
8 oz. butter, softened  
1 tbsp. vanilla extract  
2 cups powdered sugar

on St. Simons Island. Al Wessell got his 1929 President FE Flat 8, out for the event and Al is wearing the cruisers cap to match the period.



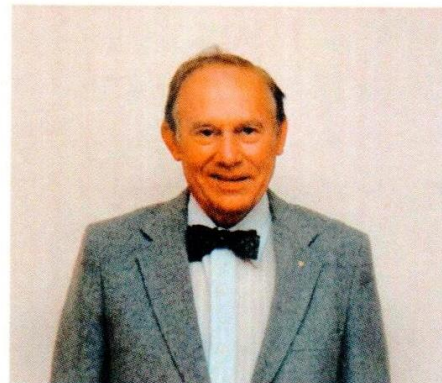

# Vesta Stoudt, Inventor of Duct Tape

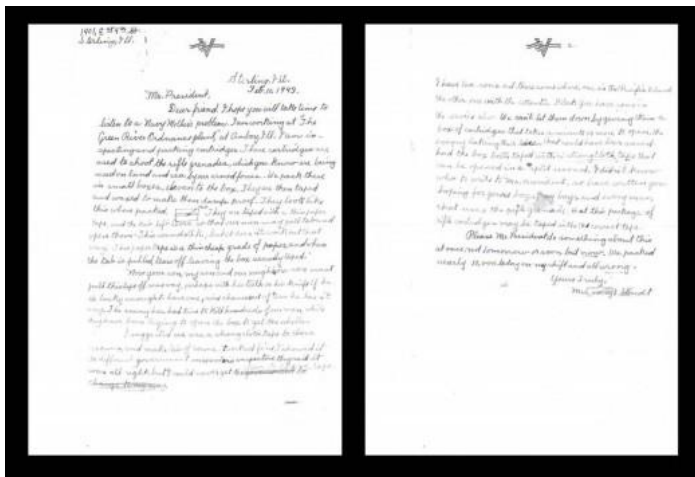

Vesta Stoudt had been working at factory, Green River Ordnance Plant between Dixon and Amboy, Illinois to do her part to help servicemen packing and inspecting these cartridges when she got to thinking that there had to be a better way.

She also happened to be a mother of two sons serving in the Navy and was particularly perturbed that their lives and countless others were left to such a chance.

Concerned for the welfare of sons, she discussed with her supervisors an idea she had to fabricate a tape made from strong, water-resistant cloth. And when nothing came of her efforts, she penned a letter to then-President Franklin Roosevelt detailing her proposal (which included a hand-drawn diagram) and closing by making a plea to his conscience:



"We can't let them down by giving them a box of cartridges that takes a minute or two to open, enabling the enemy to take lives that might be saved had the box been taped with strong tape that can be opened in a split second. Please, Mr. President, do something about this at once; not tomorrow or soon, but now."

Oddly enough, Roosevelt passed Stoudt's recommendation on to military officials, and in two weeks' time, she received notice that her suggestion is being considered and not too long after was informed that her proposal had been approved. The letter also commended her idea with of "exceptional merit."

Above is the original letter Vesta sent to President Roosevelt.

Before long, Johnson & Johnson, which specialized in medical supplies, was assigned, and developed a sturdy

cloth tape with a strong adhesive that would come to be known as "duct tape," which garnered the company an Army-Navy "E" Award, an honor given out as a distinction of excellence in the production of war equipment.

While Johnson & Johnson was officially credited with the invention of duct tape, it's a concerned mother who will be remembered as the mother of duct tape.

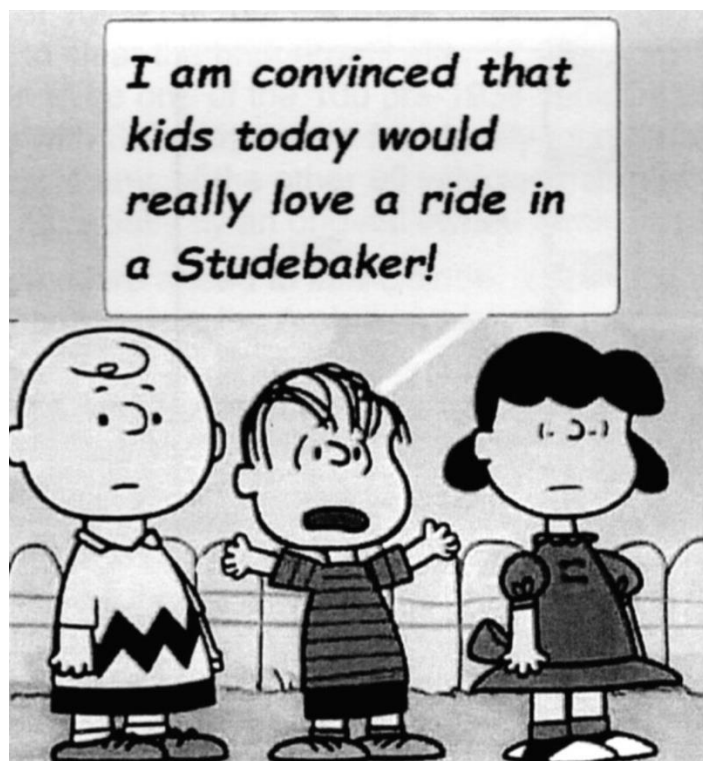

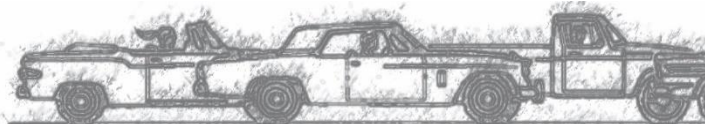

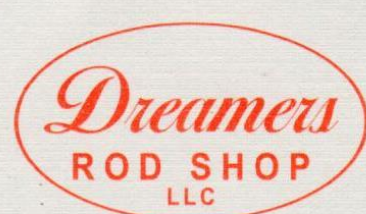
